This funding will be used to

- Increase the percentage of students from Prep to Year 6 achieving a 'C' or better in English from 89% to 91%.
- Increase the percentage of students from Prep to Year 6 achieving an 'A' or 'B' from 38% to 42%
- Continue to build the capability of staff in teaching Reading & Writing (aligned to the expectations of the Australian Curriculum) through targeted professional development, coaching, mentoring, professional learning communities and instructional leadership.
- Investigate and implement pedagogical practices and supports to target the learning needs of children in Prep and Year 1 with a focus on developing oral language skills and age appropriate pedagogical practices.
- Continue to build and develop the instructional leadership capabilities of school Leadership Team.

Our initiatives include

- Building on the instructional leadership capabilities of the school Leadership Team through an executive coaching program – enhancing team members ability to provide feedback through coaching, mentoring and facilitative questioning.
- Enhancing teacher capabilities in effective reading and writing practices through effective observation, feedback, coaching and mentoring, and watching others work (WOW).
- Continuing to provide teachers with release time to collaborate and co-plan with the Head of Curriculum focussing on embedding the Australian Curriculum (with a focus on Reading and Writing).
- Continuing to develop teacher capability to ensure clarity and consistency in delivering curriculum, monitoring and assessment, explicit student feedback and effective data analysis.
- Engaging additional teacher aide to support classroom teachers in delivering effective and researched based teaching strategies in reading and writing.
- Providing additional Speech Language Pathologist time to provide support and speech language intervention for students with additional needs.
- Establish and implement effective early intervention program to support children in the early years who are at risk of not achieving benchmarks, providing targeted intervention and additional classroom support to students with identified needs.




Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Provide additional Speech Language Pathology - \$16,000
- Release time for teacher co-planning, collaboration, coaching and mentoring - \$50,000
- Installation of Sound Field Systems (Prep and Year 1) to support oral language and hearing needs of students - \$20,000
- Additional teacher aide hours to support classroom guided reading and writing - \$162,068
- Leadership capability coaching and development - \$25,000
